The Main Gate – The Allotment committee would like to remind all allotment holders that you must always close and lock the main gate after entering or leaving the site.

Speed Limit – The speed limit of 5MPH seems to have been ignored by a number of Tenants recently. All Plot holders will have received a copy of a letter sent out by the council a copy of which has also now been attached to the Front Gate entrance.

January - Some To Do's

With the first January of a new decade upon us, the days will start to get a bit longer and although January is considered to be the coldest month of the winter, there is still time to make a start on this year's work.

If the weather allows, here are some tasks to be getting on with for the rest of January.

- If we get any January gales, check your netting/mesh if you already have onion sets in the ground
- Continue to pick Brussels sprouts. Pick them from the base of the plant up, twisting them away from the plant
- Parsnips and leeks can still be left in the ground to be lifted as needed
- If you have not done any, prune your fruit while they are dormant
- Continue to clear up the remains of any unused summer crops & compost

- January is also a good month to sort out your seed potato orders and when they arrive crack on with chitting them
- Nothing to plant out in January except Garlic and Shallots if it is mild. But think about starting some seeds off in a warm place such as a window sill or propagator if you have one
- If the ground is not frozen or too water– logged, there is still some digging that can be done, incorporating compost/organic matter as you go along. For example trenches filled with kitchen peelings for next year's runner beans
