
The following pages show the individual questions we asked and the actual response we received from all the responders. We have also included at the end of this document additional comments that the responders added to their response.

#### Q1 Do you think that you would use a community shed/hub/hut?



### Q2 Would you be prepared to help clean/maintain the community shed/hub/hut as part of separate shed/hub/hut committee?



### Q3 If there was one, what would you like to see the community shed/hub/hut used for?



### Q4 Bearing in mind the size of our allotment site, would it be better to have more than one community shed/hub/hut?



With reference to the responses in <u>Question 2</u> where many showed an interest in helping with this project, the main committee feel that this project would benefit greatly from its own sub-committee who could take over and run the project (with guidance if required from the main committee).

A sub-committee could look at and advise on such items as:
