August - Some To Do's

August is another typically a dry month so make sure you keep up with watering, particularly in Poly Tunnels. Keep up with harvesting.

With that in mind, here are some other jobs to be getting on with.

- Continue with the harvesting of all vegetable crops and keep up with the picking of runner beans to maintain cropping well into the autumn
- Continue with the lifting of potatoes
- Start to thin apples and pears down to one or two fruits per cluster
- Watch out for flea beetle on brassicas and related plants such as Swiss chard and rocket.
- Prepare to lift onions towards end of month, though they might be ready earlier
- Plant out any overwintering brassica such as spring cabbage, kales & hardy onions
- Keep that hoe working as the warming weather and rain will encourage more weeds; try to keep on top of them.




