I. UP FOR DISCUSSION

a. New Stakes.

- The next order of stakes has arrived so the task of marking plot boundaries will continue as soon as they've been painted.

b. Deliveries on site.

- If you have arranged a delivery on site, you must be there to meet the driver and supervise the delivery direct to your plot. Unsupervised deliveries to communal areas are considered as fly tipping and will be treated as such by WTC.

c. The May skips.

- The skips are booked for the first May Bank Holiday weekend in May. They will arrive on the 1st of May and will be located by the communal shed. One skip will be designated for green waste only. The other is for mixed waste. Posters will be appearing on site shortly with more information regarding opening hours and type of waste allowed. The next skips are due over the August Bank Holiday weekend.

d. Grass cutting on communal areas.

- This is usually scheduled for May and September so if tenants see the WTC tractor on site it will most likely be cutting the grass. Should tenants feel the grass in a particular area needs a trim at other times of the year, please contact the committee on the usual email address.

e. Structures and development policy and the bonfire policy.

- Both policies were ratified at the recent Leisure Services Committee meeting. WTC have sent tenants an email regarding the new documents which can also be found on WTC allotments webpage. The committee suggests all tenants familiarize themselves with the rules surrounding paving slabs, greenhouses, polytunnels, fruit cages and bonfires.

f. Plot inspections.

- Will begin the week beginning 11th May. One tenant has requested more frequent inspections, but this is something the committee cannot commit to at this time.
